Digital data are distributed over the internet with ease using advancements in information and communication technology. Foremost challenges faced during the distribution of digital data are the issues of protection of intellectual property rights and that of sole traders of text, audio, images and videos over the internet. To address this problem, watermarking is the bestapproach. Digital watermarking is an effective technology of embedding data (watermark signal) into multimedia data. The authentic owner can exhibit his ownership by inserting a robust watermark in an image and later can extract it for verification. The embedded watermark should be adequately robust to withstand image & signal processing attacks and imperceptibility should be maintained as well. The watermark can be of different forms depending upon the applications such as owner logo or fingerprints, copyright messages, patients ID in case of medical images or any other patterns in the form of binary, gray or color images. The major applications of watermarkingare Copyright Protection, Data authentication, finger printing, broadcast monitoring and so on.

Tree roots make the soil porous so that it can absorb rain and hold water when rain falls. this water in the soil is then gradually released into the river throughout the year.

If there are no trees, a destructive cycle of floods and droughts occur. during the monsoon excess water will flow over the surface and causes floods because soil does not absorb the rain water when the monsoon ends, rivers go dry because there is no moisture in the soil to feed them. this is why it is important to maintain substantial tree cover along riversides trees along riversides has several benefits according to scientific studies:

- 1. keeps rivers perennial
- 2. reduce floods
- 3. combat drought
- 4. recharge ground water
- 5. normalize rainfall
- 6. combat climate change
- 7. prevent soil erosion
- 8. improve water quality
- 9. enhance soil quality
- 10. protect biodiversity

Gal"ois: Teenage Giant and Victim of Cruel Environment

Evariste Gal ois (1811–1832) was a French mathematician whose discoveries are considered to be some of the most original mathematical ideas of the 19th century. He was born in Bourg-la—Reine in a happy and respected family. His mother was well-educated, clever, and intellectually sophisticated, and father was a charming, fun-loving man who delighted in making up clever verses about his friends. Gal ois life was one of disillusionment and disappointment. He was tutored at home by his mother, and at the age of 12Gal ois was admitted to Louis-le-Grand, a boarding school in Paris. As a boy, he had boundless energy and enthusiasm. His love for learning led him to read books of mathematics much like other boys would read mysteries. Because of his superior intelligence, school was extremely boring and unchallenging for Gal ois, and he rebelled against his teacher's harsh, domineering treatment, which he found unmotivating.

Gal ois loved to do mathematics in his head and would not bother to write out the proofs systematically on paper. This proved to be highly detrimental; he failed the entrance test for the Ecole Polytechnique as a result. Gal ois was extremely disappointed by the unjust test results because he didn't find the questions difficult. When Gal ois was 17, the great teacher Professor Louis—Paul—Emile Richard (1795—1849) came to his school. Professor Richard immediately recognized Gal ois genius and encouraged him to compile his discoveries and send them to the French Academy, which was French's finest group of scholars. Gal ois promptly took up the challenge and sent his papers to Augustin—Louis Cauchy, a professor at Ecole Polytechnique. But, most unfortunately for Gal ois, Cauchy never read his work and lost his paper as well.

Later, Gal ois decided to take the Ecole Polytechnique entrance test again. Only 2 tries were allowed, and this would be his 2^{nd} and final chance. However, the examiners had already heard of his intelligence and had their minds set against him even before the test.

They taunted him during the oral test so much that Gal ois lost his temper and hurled an eraser at them. This ended all his hopes for admission into the best school of mathematics in Europe.

At the age of 19, he produced some very important papers on algebra, in particular an important function of algebra to solve equations. Gal ois discovered the types of equations that can be solved and those that cannot be.

In a moment of optimism, he submitted his work to the Academy of Science in competition for the Grand Prize in mathematics. The Secretary received his work but died before reading it. To make matters worse, when officials went to retrieve the papers, they had mysteriously disappeared. Disappointments and setbacks finally took their toll on Gal ois and he became a very bitter man. He developed distrust for teachers and institutions and got involved in politics instead. He joined the Republicans, which was a forbidden radical group.

Gal ois was arrested a couple of times but was acquitted of every charge because they were difficult to prove. He was finally jailed for 6 months on the trumped up, trivial charge of wearing the uniform of the nonexistent National Guard.

During his sojourn in jail, Gal ois renewed his interest in mathematics. Following his release, he sorted out his papers but was unable to complete them before he was forced into a duel over a girl with whom he was barely acquainted with and hardly cared for. The duel proved to be his end. The death of Gal ois was indeed a terrible waste. If he had known that his work would be of such great significance to mathematics, life would have been meaningful for him. As it was, he died a very disappointed man. It was not until 1846 that his research was published. Mathematicians began to appreciate the importance of Gal ois work, which centered on solving equations using groups. Gal ois found a way to derive a group that corresponds to each equation. This group, called "the group of the equation" contains the important properties equations. So-called Gal ois groups form an important part of modern abstract algebra.

In a family of 10 children, I was the ninth; born 71 years ago in a sleepy little town on the eastern coast of peninsular India. The world that I was born into was a lot different from what it is now in terms of the lifestyles of people. The present day conveniences and comforts were absent then. But I got 'comforting' in ample measure whenever I was in distress! My mother as also the six brothers and two sisters who are elder to me, pampered me. Pampered only up to certain limits permitted by the dictates of discipline and restricted by the limitation on resources caused due to the sad and sudden demise of my father. Their love for me was boundless! At that point of time, giving good education to the younger brothers was of utmost concern for my older brothers. As a result of this, all of us got good education and could do very well in our lives. In the large middle class families like ours, all expenses were pre-budgeted and pocket money for children was unknown in those days. Given the conditions as they were, we the younger ones followed good financial discipline. It was fun growing up in such a big loving family! Until I joined college where sporting facilities are available, I was happy practicing only gully cricket for relaxation. The field gear for playing consisted of four bamboo sticks. The bat belonged to one of the team members and he got it as a gift from his father! This was a very costly and rare gift in those days. The owner of the bat was ipsofacto the captain of the team and he could call all the shots! Pads, guards and gloves including the wicket keeper's were unaffordable. However the ball used for playing was regular leather one bought on contributory basis; a rupee from each player. Often times, I was unable to pay my contribution and I rarely used to get a chance to bat and almost never a chance to bowl! Even when I could not pay my contribution,

I used to still go to watch the others practicing. As the wicket keeper was not provided with the required protective gear, most of the times he used to let go the ball!

There used to be thus a need for a deep third man right on the boundary line to stop/retrieve the ball. The captain(who owns the bat) perforce used to ask me to take up that position and field. Because of my great love for the game, I used to do this with the utmost dedication. My fielding skills got honed up in the process! Perhaps to keep me motivated, the captain was once in a while allowing me to bat and I always made the best use of these chances to sharpen my batting skills. I soon realized that for one to become good at batting, one has to be fearless and should never take his eyes off the ball right from the time that it leaves the bowler's hand till it is dispatched properly for runs. Also, one should never leave the stumps and shuffle towards leg side even when the bowler is throwing bodyline. After all there is a bat in hand! The mantra is 'stay there! runs will come your way!' Is it not equally true for our lives? Stay on and maintain the right poise. Everything that's due comes your way! Whenever another team challenged ours for a weekend game, I always was in the playing eleven of our team because I could save a lot of runs fielding at deep third man position in addition to chipping in with a few runs myself.

Of late everybody including Business, Politicians and Technologists are talking about Digital transformation. Digital transformation is more than a 'phenomenon' and certainly more than a technological one. According to some of the analysts we are even about to enter a genuine digital transformation economy, aka 'DX economy'. DX economy has impact on various stake holders including Business leaders, Technology builders, Technology Implementers, Researchers and finally Academicians having the influence on all the earlier categories. Look at the fig1. This shows the continuous Industry transformation. Let us look at its impact on students at various stages. Digitization started with 1st platform which referred to Mainframe and terminals. This was driven by Hardware and proprietary technologies. Business considered this as a productivity tool. Common man looked it as a threat to employment. Companies like IBM, Digital among many ruled that era. Electronic engineers and low level programmers became important. Demand was limited. Industry chose engineers, statisticians and mathematicians based on their aptitude and performance in the college and trained them on proprietary technologies. There was never a need for additional training while in the college. Because of proprietary technologies the employers only could train them. There was a paradigm shift after 20-25 years. Then came 2nd platform. Client server computing on networks ranging from LAN to Internet became the order of the day. This was driven by Software and open technologies. We had OS by Microsoft and various Unix flavors. We started getting Object oriented languages like java, DBMS like Oracle, ERP packages like

SAP and CRM packages like Siebel. Business continued to look at this as a productivity tool. Common man started looking it as a employment generator. Computer science as a branch was introduced. Focus was on training the students on fundamentals and hands-on training on one of the tools. Demand started growing, Computer science degree or any engineering degree for that matter did not give any edge for implementers. Because of the raising demands courses like MCA, B.Sc (IT) etc were introduced. Since the technologies were not proprietary parallel training and industry certification started. Unfortunately, some operators took advantage of this and many gullible students fell prey. Only those people who had strong fundamentals survived in the long run. Next wave is 3rd platform. Cloud computing, Big data and analytics, Mobile computing and social business are the new technologies taking care of million apps, billion users and trillion things. Business started looking at it as a tool to grow the business and give an edge in the competition. Implementers had a boom due to global opportunities. However the academics did not respond quickly. They are happy to cater to 2nd platform. Even after a decade the new technologies are still offered as electives. Employers shifted the 2nd platform related training time and cost to the colleges. They started taking students with good fundamentals and programming skills to train on 3rd platform. Supply is not meeting the demand. Training operators started offering internships and projects to students at a price. This is not really helping either industry or the students. Meanwhile Business needed innovation to survive and surge ahead of the competition. To fulfill this, we have innovation accelerators like IOT, Robotics, Cognitive systems, Natural interfaces, 3D printing and Next gen security to augment 3rd platform. The pace is too fast even at international scene. All these areas are highly inter disciplinary involving basic sciences, engineering branches and management sciences. According to analysts 2.5 M new jobs will be created and 1.8M old jobs will vanish in next couple of years. Anybody who catches the bus will be way ahead. Academic curriculum is lagging far behind. Unscrupulous operators are trying to cash in on the name of training at exorbitant prices. Strong fundamentals and hard work continue to be the basic qualifications. It is time for the educational institutions to go beyond curriculum and provide training to students and guide them. Students should focus on knowledge and do not fall prey to the unscrupulous operators.



The Schools We Don't Want.

There are plenty of people ready to speak out about the type of schooling we no longer want, the industrial model education of yesterday that gets perpetuated in slightly altered forms despite the weight of voices to speak out against it.

George Monbiot is a respected writer on society, politics and a prominent columnist on important issues.

In the article, with perfect justification, he attacks the industrial model of education, the gaps between what's going on in too many schools today and the skills young people need to really flourish in the Twenty First Century and the relevance and applicability of much of the knowledge being crammed in to children.

He also does a reasonable job of highlighting some of the reasons why, despite all the protests, little changes.

However, it's when Monbiot, like many other commentators before him, comes to the alternatives that we see one of the reasons why change is so difficult. He gives a number of examples – giving students ipads, taking them out in to nature, imaginary project tasks, Reggio Emilia but for many educators, parents and even the politicians the sheer variety of these different options seems to be what daunts them and eventually causes them to settle for little tweaks around the edge of the existing industrial paradigm model.

For example – if we take the 'getting back to nature' idea, I know plenty of urban brought up children for whom this would be a minor form of hell.

They would be uncomfortable with dirt, uncertainty, potential dangers and risks. Some might also be unsettled by the uncertainty of purpose, with the result that their learning in that environment is very limited and they just count off the time until they can get back inside a building.

Taking the artificially constructed projects idea, I was recently intrigued by the ideas developed by Marc Prensky. He sees a future where a great deal of children's school time is spent on real projects with real implications and real impacts.

I don't think anyone knows exactly how such an approach would work, yet. But, it's going to be fascinating to follow through on those ideas.

At one point, Monbiot's article becomes more about teachers than children. I'm afraid i don't buy in to his ideas that if you just leave teachers to do whatever they wish and go individually in whatever direction they choose, this will deliver the answers.

With justification, parents and society cannot accept that the educational outcomes for an individual child become a mere lottery and a game of chance determined by who happens to be their teacher.


We also cannot be naive that teaching is 'a calling' and a passion for every teacher in every classroom.

For an enormous number it's a job choice out of a variety. In such circumstances, we need clarity in our expectations, we need accountability and a strong commitment to supporting the learning and continuous improvement of the educators.

I don't claim that I've got all the answers any more than anyone else as to exactly how a the most ideal school education programme should look going forward.

However, I believe for all of us collaboratively, the answers lie in developing our understanding of the world our children are growing up in, their needs for the future; emotionally, socially, economically and spiritually. The child and their interrelationship with their world now in the future should drive our decision making.

THIS HUGE NEW PRIME NUMBER IS A VERY BIG DEAL

There's a new biggest known prime number in the universe.

It's called M77232917, and it looks like this:

M77232917 is a huge number, but it's just the 50th known Mersenne prime. It might not be the 50th Mersenne in numerical order, though; GIMPS has verified that there are no missing Mersenne's between 3 and the 45th Mersenne (2 ^ 37,156,667-1, discovered in 2008), but known Mersenne's 46 through 50 may have skipped over some unknown, intervening Mersenne's that have not yet been discovered. GIMPS is responsible for all 16 Mersenne's discovered since it was created in 1996. These primes aren't strictly "useful" yet, insofar as no one has found a use for them. But Caldwell's website argues that the glory of discovery should be reason enough, though GIMPS announced Pace will receive a \$3,000 prize for his discovery. In the long run, Caldwell wrote, discovering more primes might help mathematicians develop a deeper theory of when and why primes occur. Right now, though, they just don't know, and it's up to programs like GIMPS to search using raw computing force.



The Significance of Values in Education: Religious or Secular approach?

Education and teaching of moral values have been the crux of the issue in the present century. It has been observable that the dichotomy between scientific and technical education and the need for teaching of moral values continues unabatedly since the first commission under Sarvepalli Radhakrishan submitted its report in 1947. In the background of fourth industrial and technological revolution, real time communication, the issue of moral teaching from a proper perspective and the kind of values to be promoted has become more debatable. Although there has been a consensus regarding the need for moral education, there exists a dilemma whether the orientation of moral education could be religious or secular. The problem with religious orientation is that it may not be appealing to the skeptical and scientific minded youth and also increase the danger of religious fundamentalism if not given properly. In case of secular orientation, a lot of confusion exists regarding its efficacy in the times of criticism against pseudo-secularism and people's increasing dependence on religion in their lives. Another aspect is how to effectively impart this moral or ethical education to the students of the present century. My paper examines how general education or professional education remains hollow without some sort of moral values as part of curriculum and practice. It also argues how the gradual reduction of social sciences and humanities at under graduate level and the limited presence of Sciences and humanities to the extent of 15% in many engineering institutions in the era of liberalization-privatization - globalization has led to the moral crisis in our country.

If we read newspapers, we can find the rise of crimes committed by the students, particularly engineering students in the recent times. They have been found involved in chain snatching, burglary, theft, stealing money from ATMs, smuggling of sandalwood, acid attacks and even murders. For this moral turpitude on the part of the students, no one is ready to bear the responsibility as parents, teachers and the police are passing the buck to one another. The young lives are lost like those of moths attracted to fire. 1949 Report of the University Education Commission

A human being lives in the world of nature but apprehends a world of values. We can

break him on the wheel, burn him at the stake, bury him alive in a concentration camp or

crucify him, but we cannot make him lie or steal or betray the cause he believes in. Our

education should encourage the development in its members of fearlessness of mind,

strength of conscience and integrity of purpose. If human life is to remain human, it must

deepen and live by a sense of moral obligation. Without moral freedom there can be no

true democracy. (37)

Our present system of education has not been able to produce such students as it focuses more on products for corporate sector rather than enriching our democracy. This fearlessness of mind prayed for by Tagore has become rare and moral freedom has become rarer. The State silences the dissentient artists, the teachers prefer silence and the parents are content with obedience from their children. As a result, a generation of students who see more virtue in the status-quo rather than raising questions have come into being. They are techno-savvy but show traditional or even superstitious beliefs in case of religion or god. The western system encourages intellectual integrity whereas our system geared more towards marks or grades encourages cramming, discourages critical thinking and encourages traditional outlook about nature and society. A sort of illogical co-existence between this old and new methods of thinking seriously affects the progressive thinking although the very word 'progress' has come to mean different things to people with different ideologies. Students become vulnerable to circuitous thinking which hinders their development in their personal and professional life. Swami Vivekananda who argued for character-making education remarked "If education is identical with information, the libraries are the greatest sages of the world and



encyclopaedia are the greatest Rishis." Qtd. in National Policy of Education , $2016\ (4\)$

We also find that nowadays more teachers are more interested in doing just what is necessary for saving their jobs rather than inculcating respect for truth, human and democratic values and habits of self-fulfillment thinking and action among the students. 1949 Report of the University Education Commission states as follows: "A good teacher desiring to achieve results on the intellectual field must inevitably Instil into his pupils respect for right values, for truth, and inculcate habits and modes of behaviour through which their life may be moulded to their realization" for the sustenance of our democracy. (47)

Recently respect for religious values is sought to be promoted in the place of rational or secular values and invocation of god has become a regular and fashionable practice. Truth as a value is seen more as conformism rather than any desire to understand and change the unjust character of society or world. Self-fulfillment is changed into corporate 'personality development' towards earning huge salaries and creature comforts rather than plain living and high thinking. Consumerism drives the intellect of the students and nationalistic and universal values are relegated to secondary place.

In the absence of imparting right values to the students, Indian democracy faces trouble not from external forces but citizens bereft of knowledge of significance of democratic values. It is imperative to promote citizen-making education in lieu of mere programmer-making education that has come to be the aim of the technical education. Report of the Education Commission ,1964-66 emphasizes "values such as a scientific temper of mind, tolerance, respect for the culture of other national groups, etc." for democratic governance and way of life. (47)

Political democracy has become periodical elections entailing huge expenditure and economic democracy ends in the plutocracy or the control of the MNC'S over education. The rapid expansion of scientific and technical education should have led to scientific temperament among the students, appreciation of other cultures and democracy as a way of thinking and life. It can be observed that a big gap exists between degree-oriented education and inculcation of values. Scientific temperament is confined to academic life only and one's own culture is seen as the best and impatience aided by religious-centric and caste—centric identity has increased. If the students from marginal communities have taken their lives, it is attributed to individual frustration rather than to system which continued to make students scapegoats at the altar of 'merit' based education. Referring to the rural-urban educational divide the Report of the Education Commission, 1964-66 states as follows:

Again, differences in the standards of schools and colleges create an extremely intractable form of educational inequality. When admission to an institution such as a university or professional college, is made on the basis of marks obtained at the public examination at the end of the secondary stage, as often happens, the marks do not at all provide a common yardstick for a student from a rural area who attends an ill-equipped school in his village, and a student from an urban area who attends a good city school. To overcome this to some extent at least, it is necessary to evolve more reliable and egalitarian methods of selection, whether for admission to institutions or for award of scholarships. (181)

Social sciences and Humanities are seen as useless and expendable form market point of view and teachers have become mere cogs in the giant wheel of economy that encourages private profit in stead of public service. In fact after globalization which started in 1991 in India, many private degree colleges hardly bothered about humanities and social sciences. One heartening feature is that IITs have begun offering integrated and PG courses in humanities. Rabindranath Tagore wrote about the need for holistic education. He writes as follows:

We may become powerful by knowledge, but we attain fullness by sympathy. The highest education is that which does not merely give us information but makes our life in harmony with our existence. But we find that this education



of sympathy is not only systematically ignored in schools, but it is severely repressed. (qtd. in Devi Prasad)

Although curriculum can teach to an extent, more valuable things are taught by example. If we want students to learn values, we ourselves must become exemplars of values which we want them to cultivate. Aurabindo writes, "The attempt to make boys moral and religious by the teaching of moral and religious text-books is a vanity and a delusion, precisely because the heart is not the mind and to instruct the mind does not necessarily improve the heart." (27).

Aurabindo also thinks that "the first rule of moral training to suggest and invite, not command or impose. The best method of suggestion is by personal example, daily converse and the books read from day to day" (29) and practical opportunity as well as intellectual encouragement to develop all that is the best in nature. "(30)

Mother writes of the need for education of the physical, mental, vital, Psychic and spiritual. Their view of supramental education leads to a progressive development of human nature, latent faculties, change of nature itself, of total being and "a new ascent of the species above and beyond man towards man towards superman, leading in the end to the appearance of a divine race upon earth." 131

Tagore 's concept of education focuses on creativity, use of mother tongue, and cultivation of internationalism. He believed that "true education can be received in an atmosphere of voluntary poverty" (Prasad 17)

There are similarities between Aurobindo's and Tagore's concepts of education. Devi Prasad writes that Tagore often remarked that "the responsibility of education is to see that the growth of the body, mind and heart takes place in a balanced manner." (25) Tagore also writes that "the major task of the university is to create the climate of education. To impart it is only the minor part of its work," (52) Tagore also invokes the ideal of tapovan and wants religion to become an integral part of life rather than routine. He says,

The lamp does not go around saying that it will give light to others; it depends on its own capacity to what degree it can show the way to others. Religion is the same, it is like light. Giving and receiving religious education is one and the same process. (qtd. in Prasad 65.

Both Aurobindo and Tagore emphasized the importance of instruction respect for child's nature, mother tongue for recovering of national spirit, and the need to encourage spontaneity or creativity in the child. Aurobindo writes,

The mother-tongue is the proper medium of education and therefore the first energies of the child should be directed to the thorough mastering of the medium. Almost every child has an imagination, an instinct for words,, a dramatic faculty, a wealth of idea and fancy. These should be interested in the literature and history of the nation. (34)

At present the corporate sector has been offering education in English medium from class one. The municipal schools In Andhra Pradesh also want to follow the suit in the name of employment prospects for the poor children when they finish their education. This move is supported by some bureaucrats and also the parents who are disappointed with two kinds of education- one for the rich and another for the poor prevailing in the country. Although it appears pragmatic, the net result would be stifling of the creativity of students under the tutelage of teachers who are not proficient in English.

Devi Prasad notes that Tagore wanted to enthrone the mother tongue for reawakening of society and reestablishing our self-esteem. He gave lectures to scholars and in convocations in universities in Bengali instead of in English. Prasad writes: "To feel proud for one's own language is to build self-confidence and to respect one's strength hat was why Rabindranath considered mother tongue as one of the most important centers of education." (29)

The National Policy of Education, 2016 reminds us that Under Article 29 (1), the Constitution recognizes the study and preservation of one's mother tongue as a Fundamental Right and



Article 350 A requires every State and local authority to provide adequate facilities for instruction in the mother-tongue at the primary stage of education to children belonging to linguistic minority groups. (17)

The present researcher remembers his school and college days when Telugu detailed textbooks and non-detailed imbibed national consciousness, taste for literature and humanistic values in the minds of the students. In the last two and half decades, students have begun taking Sanskrit and French for scoring marks and ranks and in engineering colleges Telugu is not offered as second language in graduation unlike in general degree courses. As a consequence, students have become alienated from their mother tongue and literature in it and their English also hasn't improved in spite of the best efforts of the well meaning teachers. There a came a crop of new generation of the young students who have been mechanical minded, technological parasites and morally depraved. They have been unfortunately alienated form moral roots, literary fruits and democratic values. It's high time we realized the importance of holistic education and end compartmentalization of knowledge and hierarchy of knowledge. This holistic nature of education would address the moral needs of our students apart from their cognitive and material needs.

Yashpal committee report 2009 states the need for multi-disciplinarity in stead of "cubicalization" of knowledge." (10) As Yashpal committee recommended, the IITs have begun producing scholars in literature, linguistics and other social sciences. According to the report, the performance of a university "can be assessed by asking what steps it has taken to reduce gender, caste and class asymmetries, the modality of such steps, and their outcomes." (27) The committee has also argued for the link between the knowledge products of university and "the university's immediate social and natural milieu." (28)

The spirit of enquiry is another thing required to question the outdated practices in education. The report criticizes the academic community's failure to protect autonomy from the political and bureaucratic interference. The report also points out that if corrupt practices in higher education are not ended either by persuasion or vigilant society, "a significant number of disappointed and frustrated youth may take to ways that lead to violence and social disorder." (.47)

In fact, the Indian State has adopted a harsh stance towards the questioning youth since emergency in 1975, that many spirited youth lost their lives in confrontation with the repressive organs of the State. Of late not a few students such as Rohit Vemula in Hyderabad and Anita of Tamilnadu suffered death in the systemic way. Many young students lost their lives or suffered nervous tension at the altar of corporate education at plus two level. There needs to a revamp of educational system and democracy which have been leading to physical and moral casualties.

The 1986-1992 NPE wanted to include in the curriculum The history of India's freedom movement, the constitutional obligations and other content essential to nurture national identity" to "emphasize India's common cultural heritage, egalitarianism, democracy, secularism, equality of the sexes, protection of the environment, removal of social barriers, observance of the small family norm, inculcation of the scientific temper and an international outlook characterized by peaceful co-existence and understanding between nations, treating the whole world as one family. (21)

The Parliamentary Standing Committee on Human Resources Development, in its 86th Report submitted to both Houses of Parliament on 26 February, 1999 recommendations referred to the following:

Truth (satya), Righteous conduct (Dharma), Peace (Shanti), Love(Prem), and Non-violence (Ahimsa) are ...indeed universal values and respectively represent the five domains of human personality: intellectual, physical, emotional, psychological and spiritual. They also are correspondingly co-related with the five major objectives of education, namely, knowledge, skills, balance, vision, and identity.



The committee report also wants to students to realize the commonness of religious principles despite some differences in practices and learn peaceful coexistence

According to National Policy of Education, 2016 which realized the violent consequences of caste and religion, social and economic disparities, "Value education has to be made an integral part of education at all levels. Teachers, parents and community leaders have to play a major role in instilling good values among students." (170).

It also says

Schools must develop in students, qualities like regularity and punctuality, cleanliness, good conduct, consideration for the elderly and respect for women. The process of education should inculcate a spirit of hard work and entrepreneurship, a respect for human rights and compassion for the disadvantaged sections of society. Every student should be made aware not only of his/her fundamental rights, but also of fundamental duties, laid down by the Constitution. The National Policy on Education should enable students to become responsible citizens of India in a globalized world. (170)

Conclusion

The crisis in the system is acute, palpable and ought to be reversible in the interests of the young India. Swami Abhedananda, the disciple of Swami Vivekananda writes that in the Hindu ideal of civilization, "Education does not mean intellectual culture, but the development and spiritual unfoldment of the soul in all the various branches of learning." P.7 Referring to Buddha and Kapila who didn't believe in personal God, he writes that in ancient India "You may believe in god, or you may not, but so long as you are moral and spiritual man, you are worshipped and honoured by the masses as the ideal of the nation."

The Education policy of 2016 saw the future in investment on children, "the need to bridge the educational divide," and the "optimal use of technology, without compromising on India's traditions and heritage."

Whether we follow religion-centric teaching or secular value-centric teaching, the final aim of our education should be to make students not only economical beings but also ethical beings. Gandhi says, If wealth is lost, nothing is lost; If health is lost, something is lost; if character is lost, every thing is lost. It is better to give freedom to students to inculcate humanizing values in their preferred way. While excessive dose of religion could lead to fanaticism, mere secularcentric values may make students mechanically materialistic. It would be better to remember Bertrand Russell's words, "Remember humanity and Forget the Rest."

Terrace garden reduces room temperature by upto 10° making life cooler (saving electricity for air conditioning and reducing global temperature as well)

Requirements

Terrace Space, Sunlight, Water, Pots, Soil, Seeds, Vermicompost, Earthworms,

Panchgavya, Neem Oil, Trellis or poles, Shade Net.

Steps

1. Get your mindset ready

Set aside atleast one hour per day for to take care of your garden. Get ready to get dirty, playing with mud and manure. It is healthy. Be prepared to deal with insects and pests. Start with a plan. Take small

steps. Be prepared for failures. Keep learning.

Do some research. Meet the people from the local Horticulture Department. Check the internet for useful information.

- **2** .Soil preparation- Soil, cocopeat and manure (compost, cow dung etc) can be mixed in 1:1:1 ratio to make the soil ready for the pots. Ensure that the pots have holes at the bottom to drain excess water.
- **3. Sowing** -Get good quality disease resistant seeds from an agri shop or from ripened vegetables and fruits of previous harvest, suitable for the season
- **4. Germination-** Some plants which can be transplanted can be made to germinate in a tray first and once 5-6 leaves come, can be transplanted in to the pots.
- **5. Pest management-** One cannot avoid pests. Aphids and bugs are the most common pests. And ants help to spread them. Neem oil spray can be used to get rid of aphids and bugs. Boric acid can be used to prevent ants. Neem cake can be used to prevent root based infections.

Precautions

- 1. Water plants only when required, preferably in the mornings. In general watering on alternate days is good unless the soil has dried fully. Do not water the leaves or the base of the main root. Pour water around the base of the plant away from the main root.
- 2. Add compost once a week
- 3. Spray neem oil water mix once a month to keep pests away.
- 4. Plants with fibrous root system are preferable for terrace farming.
- 5. Avoid chemicals and pesticides to have an organic garden

Art and Humanhood


